Separately Invested Funds Overview (\$165.2 million)

The UT System Separately Invested Funds (SIFs) consist of approximately 105 privately raised endowments and charitable remainder trusts where the nature of the underlying asset or donor restrictions preclude investment in the Long Term Fund. Distributions from SIF endowments support a variety of academic and health programs at UT System institutions.



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Did you know...

Atherosclerosis is the cause of over 16,000 deaths each year in the United States.

The American Heart Association reports that atherosclerosis, or hardening of the arteries, is a leading cause of many deaths from heart attack and stroke. Although the causes of atherosclerosis are multifactorial, great strides are being made in the management of this disease. Dr. K. Lance Gould, professor of cardiology at UT Health Science Center at Houston, is director of the Weatherhead P.E.T. Center for Preventing and Reversing Atherosclerosis, a program that uses state-of-the-art three-dimensional imaging called Positron Emission Tomography (P.E.T.) to diagnose and assess heart problems. P.E.T. studies blood flow and metabolic activity within the body to gather information not available through other procedures such as CT or MRI. Dr. Gould combines P.E.T. with a reversal program of diet, behavior modification and drug treatment to halt and reverse atherosclerosis. The Center began with a \$4 million gift in 1997 from two of Dr. Gould's patients, Al and Celia Weatherhead, but has quickly become a \$10 million endowment campaign due to matching funds and subsequent gifts. Dr. Gould reports that "The Weatherhead P.E.T. Center culminates a 30-year effort to stop the often sudden and unexpected tragedies of coronary heart disease."
